Dr. Zarina Blankenbaker joined Tarrant County College as the Northwest Campus President in June 2017. Dr. Blankenbaker came to TCC Northwest from Richland College in Dallas, where she served as the executive vice president of academic affairs and student success, providing leadership for more than 20,000 students.
